You, the members, have considerable influence in shaping the role of IOBG in your community. Grab hold and own your role. Ask yourself, would my spouse or significant other enjoy this get together? I do not mean just a picnic. Include them in your plans for a service project or fundraiser. Your spouse or significant other will take as much pride in its success as you do.

Work with your Auxiliary to help plan district activities. By way of a suggestion, form a joint committee whose primary job is to keep the district energized and engaged.

# First Vice President Bud Higginson

Member retention: The reduction in membership over the last several years, i.e. down from approximately 4,000 to approximately 1500/1600 members today is concerning. It is not only IOBG with the problem, other organizations have the same thing. Why does this problem exist? Members have other interests (activities) to be involved in and don't have interest in the same old things offered by their chapter.

Groups that keep updating their programs do not have a retention problem. Surveys and studies have been made in the past to try to resolve this problem with some

success, but that has not totally solved the problem. What if areas of IOBG shared with each other what programs they are doing to keep their members interested and active?

In 2013, District 8 took a survey of all the activities or what each of the chapters was doing and published the results for all the chapters to see. The results were very good with some of the chapters using the activities of other chapters to create interest. It was especially good for younger and new chapters to get started on the right foot. A similar type of survey on an area/district bases might be useful.

With the blessing of the Executive Committee, the project began to move forward with the Area Vice Presidents taking the lead with the assistance of the district directors and others. The survey will be completed during the first quarter of 2017 with the results published for all to see and hopefully be used by some chapters to help reduce the decline in membership.

It is up to all of us to identify the areas of need and make a concentrated effort to resolve the issues. That will be one of my goals for the upcoming year.

Looking back over the past year, some of the highlights of the Executive Committee actions that were ratified at the Annual Board of Directors Meeting were updating the brochure, adopting a program to directly bill all members of districts who asks for that assistance, or those districts whose membership rolls decreased by more than 20% from the 2014 base year, and adopting a program to provide membership cards to non-North American members for \$11 annual dues payment.

Of those, I consider the most labor intensive and most important accomplishment to be the updating of the brochure. The brochure we have been using for years was in sore need of updating. The Executive Committee over the course of several months undertook that chore. President-Elect Rosalie Davis Green led the effort and with input from Bud Higginson and others, we went through the revision drafts word by word, paragraph by paragraph and picture by picture. I think we were up to draft version #16 before we approved the final version for printing and distribution. The new brochure has been very well received. The feedback has been very complimentary.

I first became a member of the International Order of the Blue Gavel in 1983 when the Marathon Yacht Club Chapter received its charter. Many years have passed since then and my membership in Blue Gavel continues to be an extremely rewarding experience. We became friends with many Past Commodores and their significant others as we shared many fun times and delightful excursions together. We look forward to many more such memorable get-togethers with the friends we have come to know

# Treasurer Marshall Nemoy

<u>Financial Results:</u> I presented the financial statements for the nine months ended September 30, 2016 to the members attending the Annual Meeting sessions at Marina del Rey in Los Angeles, California. IOBG had a net income of \$34,010 which is \$4,102 lower than last year at the same date. This occurred by lower than expected dues collections and expenses that exceeded budget. In spite of this we were able to increase our cash reserves and our total equity. The reasons vary according to the subject. The discussions of each activity will shed more light on the changes in the Balance Sheet.

<u>International Operations Center:</u> Dues collections for this activity were \$1,845 lower than budget and \$2,973 lower than last year. In addition, less people subscribed to the Log this year. Total expenses were \$560 lower than budgeted but \$767 higher than last year. Most of the variance from year to year was due to timing differences in payment of routine expenses.

<u>Executive Committee:</u> Most of the expense of this activity involves the travel budget. This year the total expenses were \$4,591 lower than budgeted but \$4,816 greater than last year. This occurs each year because the February and August meetings are in alternating years. This year we did not have a February meeting but did have a meeting in August.

<u>Annual Meeting:</u> This activity occurs in October. However, expenses related to the event are disbursed earlier in the year to the host committee and are purchased in advance of the meeting dates. As of September 30 the activity has spent \$316 less than was anticipated and \$57 more than last year at this date. The bulk of the expenses will occur in October and November.

<u>Area Vice Presidents:</u> Again, this activity has not spent the funds that were allotted to it. As of September 30, the total expenses are \$7,191 lower than budget and \$2,949 less than last year. The accounting for this activity was slightly modified by splitting the travel between travel within their area of responsibility and travel to attend Regional Meetings.

<u>Communications Group:</u> The activity which includes The Blue Gavel Log, The Lighthouse and our web site has stayed within their budget and has spent less than last year. The drop in subscriptions may be due to more members accepting the electronic version of The Blue Gavel Log.

<u>The membership statistics</u>: As of September 30, 2016 the report shows we lost 36 members this year. The Executive Committee has instructed the Treasurer to send dues billings for 2017 directly to the members of districts whose membership has dropped by 20 % or more. Such bills will be sent in early January of each year. The practice has been employed with districts that have suffered a lack of leadership and asked the IOC to assist thus allowing those members who wished to maintain their membership to do so conveniently.

<u>2017 Budget:</u> The 2017 Budget was discussed at the Annual Meeting and approved by a vote of the board of directors. The dues for 2017 will be \$50 per year. The approved budget contained slightly more expenses than revenues. While such an action was within the resources of the organization, if such a practice continues, it will not be possible to hold the dues at the \$50 per year rate.

<u>2017 Dues:</u> Dues are due in January of each year. As an accommodation to those who fly south for the winter, we will make every effort to get you your card as soon as possible. However, keep in mind we must wait until we have all the materials in place such as the president's letter before we can issue cards. For those who have already sent in their 2017 dues remember we must receive the dues from your district treasurer before we can process your card. If you have not received your 2017 membership card by early December, contact your district treasurer. District treasurers are provided a list of members receiving membership cards on the same date as the card is mailed to the member.

We thank all the district treasurers for their assistance in processing all the membership data during the year. Now that the days are getting shorter and the nights colder it is time for all the holiday celebrations. May your holidays be filled with happiness and joy.


