

BERNARD "BUD" EUGENE HIGGINSON, AGE 90, OF OSPREY, FL, PASSED AWAY AT 11:15 A.M., FRIDAY, DECEMBER 1, 2023, AT MAJESTIC CARE OF NEWBURGH IN NEWBURGH, IN.

BUD WAS A UNITED STATED ARMY VETERAN AND SERVED IN THE KOREAN WAR. HE RECEIVED HIS ENGINEERING DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO. HIS CAREER TOOK HIM TO PHOENIX, CINCINNATI, MISSISSIPPI, AND MARION, ILLINOIS, WITH NOTABLE PROJECTS BEING THE FIRST TOILET SEAT DESIGN TO GO INTO SPACE, AND STAR WARS FIGURINES FOR KENNER. BUD MOVED BACK HOME TO HENDERSON, KY IN 1980. HE BECAME PRESIDENT OF CYANIDE PLASTICS. DURING THAT TIME, HE SERVED ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR HENDERSON MUNICIPAL POWER AND LIGHT AND OHIO VALLEY NATIONAL BANK, NOW KNOWN AS FIELD AND MAIN. BUD WAS ALSO A KENTUCKY COLONEL. HE RETIRED AND MOVED TO OSPREY FLORIDA IN THE 90'S WHERE HE BECAME COMMODORE OF THE VENICE YACHT CLUB AND PRESIDENT OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORDER OF BLUE GAVEL. BUD ENJOYED TRAVELING, BOATING, DINING, OLD CARS AND MOTORCYCLES. HE WAS A MASTER OF GRILLING STEAKS AND PERFECTED HIS CAESAR SALAD RECIPE THAT HE HONED FROM COUNTRIES ALL OVER THE WORLD.

In addition to his parents, William Edgar and Ladew Higginson, Bernard was preceded in death by his wife, Laura Higginson; son, Greg Higginson; and his brothers, William "Billy" and Jerry Higginson. Bernard is survived by his son, Gary Higginson; his grandchildren, Michelle Williams (Josh) and Gary Higginson (Lauren); along with several nieces and nephews.



The Nominating Committee consists of the Immediate Past President, who chairs the committee, and the Past President preceding the Immediate Past President, the President, and two (2) IOBG members, who are not officers in any Blue Gavel Chapter or District. One member shall be from East of the Mississippi River and the other Member shall be from West of the Mississippi River. The two IOBG members are selected by the Area Vice Presidents and District Directors from their respective areas, and shall serve for two years, with their terms alternating. - Maintaining a balance of Officers by region
- Willingness to continue to serve, and move up through higher offices
- Nominee has served as a District Director

The Committee will present a slate of officers to the Executive Committee, for their approval by their July meeting. The slate of officers shall be printed in the LOG or the Liighthouse by mid-August.

Our Bylaws also allow for nominations by petition. Petitions should be signed by at least 2 members from each chapter, and no less than three different Chapters. Petitions should be filed with the Secretary no more than 30 days from the official posting of the Slate of Officers.

The Secretary will include all nominations with the Notice of the Annual Meeting.

An idea was born that day that has started to take hold in IOBG. With the full approval of the Executive Committee, we are working together with SAYC to build a pilot program that supports efforts to promote youth programs of all sorts within Yacht Clubs. After all, the youth ARE the yacht Club members of tomorrow!

In a nutshell, this idea is based on developing a framework that allows IOBG members with expertise in developing youth programs, funding youth programs and capital campaign fundraising in general, to leverage that knowledge and experience through a central hub managed by IOBG International. This central "hub" will not only connect Past Commodores with experience with clubs LOOKING for experience and new ideas, but will also act as a repository of templates, documents and plans that have proven successful in the past that any Chartered club can access and use in any way they choose.

You will hear more about it in the upcoming months. In the short term, if you or any IOBG Member you know has had successful experience in capital campaigns, or setting up and funding youth programs of any sort, we WANT to get you involved in this program. In addition, we will send you materials as they are developed for comments and suggestions.

We all know that these programs are expensive and many yacht clubs end up burning members out as they try to keep the funding needed to sustain such important programs. Wouldn't it be amazing if IOBG as an organization could provide a resource or resources that help ease this pressure just a-bit? That's the vision ... and we hope many of you will relate to it and help us make it successful.

Looks like Spring is coming early and many in the Area are preparing for an early launch here in the Great Lakes.



SOUTHEAST VICE PRESIDENT MARK CAIN


