





We are trying to move most of the money into an interest-bearing account but are hampered by the banks' procedures and our bylaws. Jack will keep working on that.



The decision to distribute The Gulfstream, our bimonthly online news magazine to all chapters and members east of the Mississippi River is paying off! Our new version is a bimonthly "magazine" of over 20 pages, and is chock-full of photos and stories about yacht clubs and yacht club people all over the Northeastern and Southeastern regions — whether they're Blue Gavel or not — and people are taking notice and asking to be included.

- All nominations shall be with the written concurrence of the nominee
- Maintaining a balance of Officers by region
- Willingness to continue to serve, and move up through higher offices
- Nominee has served as a District Director

The Committee will present a slate of officers to the Executive Committee, for their approval by their July meeting. The slate of officers shall be printed in the LOG or the Liighthouse by mid-August.

Our Bylaws also allow for nominations by petition. Petitions should be signed by at least 2 members from each chapter, and no less than three different Chapters. Petitions should be filed with the Secretary no more than 30 days from the official posting of the Slate of Officers.

The Secretary will include all nominations with the Notice of the Annual Meeting.


