



This 3-night cruise will be to two ports in the Bahamas giving us enough time to enjoy a leisurely cruise along with conducting IOBG business.


Marsha Landreth has volunteered to be our IOBG cruise guide as she has multiple trips on various cruise lines over the years.



DR. SMITH SERVED 10 YEARS AS AN SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR IN FOUNTAIN VALLEY, 3 YEARS AS SUPERINTENDENT IN RICHLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT IN KERN COUNTY, AND SMITH WAS SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS IN NATIONAL CITY FOR 8 YEARS.

HE WAS VERY ACTIVE AT THE SOUTHWESTERN YACHT CLUB AND SERVED AS PRESIDENT OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORDER OF THE BLUE GAVEL AUXILIARY, A ORGANIZATION FOR PARTNERS OF COMMODORES OF YACHT CLUBS. HIS WIFE, KATHY WAS INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT IN 2022,-2023.




SECOND VICE PRESIDENT REPORT

Spring is here in the Pacific Northwest, and we have a busy calendar with a growing membership in District 1. Thanks to past Commodore Ken Johnson, we're adding a new Chapter at Seattle Singles Yacht Club — a vibrant group with an active schedule and extensive community engagement. Also, our Lake Chelan Yacht Club Chapter has reinvigorated itself under their new Commodore, Carl Polson (who is also a past Commodore), who's joined himself and recruited at least 4 other past Commodores to join with him!

District 1's President, Alan Kester of Kingston Cove Yacht Club, represented us at the flag ceremony for our first event of the season — Tacoma Yacht Club's 73 rd annual Daffodil Festival on April 12th . Blue Gavel and the Daffodil Festival were founded at about the same time, and Rainier Yacht Club's website (home of IOBG Founder, Ev Henry) carries a photo of the IOBG boat in one of those first parades.

On April 26th we held our spring membership meeting at the Suquamish Clearwater Resort, near the charming little city of Poulsbo, renowned as "Little Norway" for its Scandinavian architecture and heritage. We also visited the US Naval Undersea Museum in nearby Keyport, which highlights the extensive naval presence in Kitsap County.

Washington's biggest yachting event is the Seattle Yacht Club Opening Day, held every year since 1909 (less than 20 years after Washington became a state!). District 1 attended the flag ceremony here, too, alongside Commodores and Presidents from 56 yacht clubs and associations throughout the area. After a two-year lapse, IOBG again had a boat in the parade that followed, thanks to Chuck Riess, past Commodore of Des Moines Yacht Club.

Our most recent event was attending Des Moines YC's Opening Day for South Sound on May 10th. Neil Kelly, a past President of District 1 and DMYC past Commodore, represented IOBG alongside 12 other clubs from the area.

We're looking forward to a big induction of new members at Lake Chelan Yacht Club on June 14th. Located in the North Cascade mountains, the lake is the country's third deepest and, with nearby peaks almost 6,600 feet above its surface, resembles a fjord. Then, on July 19th, we have our summer picnic in La Conner, a small, historic town (for the Northwest) and gateway to the San Juan Islands.
